- **2021 CCSI-SARE Soil Health Trainings**
 - Core Cover Crops and Soil Health – will be virtual
 - 3-Day (Soil Health and Sustainability for Midwestern Field Staff) – last week in August, right before Labor Day
 - Planning team is working out details to keep virtual events from being too long and other considerations for effective training, including potential for partners' limited travel due to either covid or budget cuts.
 - Stephanie and Joe have been recording videos in the field pertaining to soil health assessments, demos and more; they are working to process them and then make them available to partners
- **Brainstorming**
 - Virtual events have become the norm, the positives include no travel time and no travel costs allowing more participants; networking opportunities are lost though, particularly hard for newer employees. The opportunity to utilize breakout rooms in virtual sessions helps with this a bit.

- Trainings that are exclusive to newer employees – what resources and programs are available - and trainings that are exclusive to more veteran employees that dive-in deeper and help reignite conservation passion
 - Manure workshops – the use of manure is growing
 - Highlight the results of our conservation efforts
 - Establishment of any type of vegetation in riparian/stream corridors.
 - 60 inch corn rows – Relay cropping and/or grazing cover crops
 - Advancements for new technology in seeding cover crops.
 - Other (non-soil health) subjects:
 - Septic maintenance, especially for rural areas
 - How to talk to landowners about permits needed (IDEM, IDNR, etc.) when working in/near streams

- Barry Fisher retiring effective 12/31/2020
 - VUJC Land Stewardship Initiative/Dubois Co SWCD will host a Soil Diagnostic Lunch N Learn Series with 4 sessions on Wednesdays in February.
 - IASWCD is planning another series of lunch and learns, likely in February or March, 2021
 - Andrea Baker reported that the NNE IDEA area would like to produce educational videos that can help producers, new employees, etc. – the goal is to address common questions with these videos, meeting in January to compile a more detailed list of what to address
 - Kristi Todd stated she will be seeking speakers for an Upper Mississinewa project
 - Indiana Silver Jackets, this is a group that focuses on IN stream health and flooding education – will be developed and tailored for different parts of Indiana – NE, NW, SE, SW
 - Because of paywall issues, CCSI is replacing SurveyMonkey with QuestionPro for surveys. The free version of QuestionPro has more options and is more user friendly than SurveyMonkey.
